





Ron Elisha (Playwright) Ron Elisha is a playwright based in Melbourne, Australia. His stage plays include In Duty Bound, Einstein, Two, Pax Americana, The Levine Comedy, Safe House, Esterhaz, Impropriety, Choice, Unknown Soldier, The Goldberg Variations, A Tree, Falling, Ladies & Gentlemen, Wrongful Life, Controlled Crying, Renaissance, The Schelling Point, Carbon Dating, Stainless Steel Rat, produced in London under the title Man In The Middle, The Crown Versus Winslow, Love Field, The Soul Of Wittgenstein, Certificate Of Life, Window, Unsolicited Male, I Really Don't Care, Falling In Love Again, Donating Felix, and Everyman & His Dog. He has also written a telemovie, Death Duties, two children's books, Pigtales and Too Big, and hundreds of feature articles and stories in magazines, newspapers, and journals. Ron's plays have been produced throughout Australia, New Zealand, USA, United Kingdom, Canada, Poland, Israel, and France, and have won a number of awards, including four Australian Writers' Guild Awards, the Mitch Matthews Award (2006), and the Houston International Film Festival Award for Best Screenplay. He has also been shortlisted for many awards over the years, including the Carlo Annoni International Playwriting Award (2021 finalist), the Woodward International Playwriting Award (2020 finalist), the Patrick White Award (twice, most recently in 2019), the Screencraft Stage Play Contest (2019 semi-finalist), the Noosa Arts One Act Play Competition (2020), the Griffin Award (five times), The Victorian Green Room Awards (twice), the Australian Writers' Guild (four times) and various state Premiers' Awards.

Alexis Fishman (Anne) Born and raised in Sydney, Australia, Alexis is a Helpmann Award-nominated actor and singer, and graduate of the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts. She's been seen on stage in Australia at the Sydney Opera House, Melbourne's State Theatre, the Adelaide and Melbourne Cabaret Festivals, and the Sydney Theatre Company. Select show highlights include the Sydney Premiere of Kiss Of The Spiderwoman (Spiderwoman/Aurora), the national tour of Shout! (Marianne), and the Australian premiere of Urinetown (Little Sally.) Alexis is the creator of seven solo shows, including the award-winning Club Gelbe Stern, (Outstanding individual performance, NYMF). Her shows have toured across Australia and the US and played in New York at 54 Below, JCC Manhattan, Laurie Beechman Theatre, Pangea, and the Triad. A recent highlight was performing Amy Winehouse: Resurrected alongside Amy's father Mitch Winehouse at City Winery, NYC. Alexis holds an MA in International Relations from Deakin University, Melbourne, and was honored to sing for troops in Iraq and Afghanistan during the Iraq war. She is a board member of 3GNY, an educational non-profit for the descendants of Holocaust Survivors, and tells her grandparents' story in New York public schools. Her personal essays have been published in two books and she regularly coaches cabaret workshops, helping clients realize their dreams of creating engaging, intriguing, and sparkling cabaret shows. She lives in Westchester, NY with her husband and baby girl.



Amanda Brooke Lerner is a multiple-award-winning actress with over fifty film and television credits including Awkwafina Is Nora from Queens (opposite B.D. Wong), Mac & Cheese (opposite Julia Garner) Starz Power (opposite Omari Hardwick), and the upcoming feature Brooklyn with Francesca Scorcese and Margaret Cho. Theatrically, she originated the role of Marie in Kirt Shineman's Good Grief at The Cell (in association with Dramatists Guild Foundation); appeared as Dr. Judy Wood in Basket Weaver at Playwrights Horizons; Lillie in Still, Birth at Theatre for A New City; regionally as Blanche Dubois in A Streetcar Named Desire; and countless readings in the Playwright/Directors Unit at The Actors Studio. She was recently cast as the lead in the new dramedy, Bonus Life with New Circle Theatre Co., 3rd generation of Circle Rep and home of the late Lanford Wilson. A proud member of SAG•AFTRA and AEA, Amanda holds a BFA in Acting from Rutgers University and has trained extensively with legendary teachers including Bill Esper, Larry Moss, Maggie Flanigan, Tim Phillips, and currently studies with Deborah Hedwall. Amanda is the CEO and Founder of The Actor & The Biz and has built a tremendous reputation as an acting and career coach specializing in educating and preparing actors for the rigors and realities of show biz.
